For the first time in Tokyo: Lucerne Festival Ark Nova, September 19-4 October 2017

Tokyo/Lucerne, 24 July 2017. For its fourth season, the mobile concert hall known as the Lucerne Festival Ark Nova will be constructed on site in the park Grass Square in Tokyo Midtown in the Japanese capital of Tokyo, where it will be in operation from 19 September to 4 October 2017, immediately before the start of the upcoming Asian tour by the Lucerne Festival Orchestra.

As has been the case in the first three years, social engagement will play a significant role. The planned offerings call for educational projects for children and youth as well as concert programs ranging from traditional Japanese music to European classical and jazz at low ticket prices. As in previous years, musicians from the Lucerne Festival Orchestra will perform in the Ark Nova this year, as will, for the first time, an ensemble of the Lucerne Festival Alumni. Details of the programming will be announced at a later date.

About the Creation of the Lucerne Festival Ark Nova

Following the catastrophe of 11 March 2011 in Japan's Tōhoku Region, the Japanese star architect Arata Isozaki, the British artist Anish Kapoor, together with Michael Haefliger, Executive and Artistic Director of Lucerne Festival and the Japanese concert agent Masahide Kajimoto developed the idea of using music to provide encouragement and assurance to people while the region is being rebuilt. For this purpose, Anish Kapoor and Arata Isozaki designed the world's first mobile and inflatable concert hall, the Lucerne Festival Ark Nova. It was constructed for its inaugural season of performances in 2013 in Matsushima, Japan. Thereafter, the Ark Nova operated during the fall of 2014 in Sendai and, in 2015, in Fukushima. The Ark Nova was given the Classical:NEXT Innovation Award in Rotterdam in 2015.

About Lucerne Festival

Lucerne Festival encompasses a series of internationally leading festivals in the realm of classical music. Each year three distinct festivals take place: the Easter, the Summer, and the Piano Festival. The most acclaimed symphony orchestras come to Lucerne to perform. The Lucerne Festival Orchestra brings internationally acclaimed orchestral musicians to Lucerne each summer for a two-week period, Riccardo Chailly is the orchestra's Music Director. Equally important is the development of emerging talent in the areas known as Lucerne Festival Young and in the Lucerne Festival Academy, which is under the directorship of Artistic Director
